Parents Portal

We are glad to mention that we officially launched the parents' portal in our iSAMs platform. For it to be effective, all parents are expected to register. Once this is done, the following will be some of the immediate benefits:

- Provides basic electronic forms that can be used for surveys,
- Provides secure access to school information policies, handbooks, school timetables etc.
- Publishes downloadable PDF versions of each child's academic report,
- · Publishes individual pupil timetables, and
- Publishes attendance information morning/afternoon class and lesson registration.

We are in the process of piloting the release of end term reports for Year 1s to Year 11s using this. You will receive a link that will direct you to the portal.

IGCSE Preparations

The preparation for the May/June series is ongoing. Our candidates are having final touches on their revision as they wait to officially start the exams on 4th May. We are working closely with our exam body CIE (Cambridge International Examinations) and are assured by their commitment as captured here, "We continue to plan for exams to go ahead in June 2021 where it is permitted and safe. We know exams are the fairest and most accurate way of assessing students' performance". This together with the government's stand on candidates, we are looking forward to written exams. Our teachers are at hand to support the candidates even during the holidays. It is our hope that with the drive to finish strong, the results will be rewarding.



During phonics session we reviewed phase 2 and 3 sounds in both reading and writing. We looked at new Easter vocabulary during our 'in the moment learning'










We practised skills that we have covered e.g. simple addition to 10 and formation of numbers 1-20.



The children had a discussion about what Easter is, how it is celebrated and who celebrates it. One of our students had a story book to show the events that occur during Easter.








Expressive arts and designs/Understanding the World

The students did an experiment to find out how water is transported in plants.






COMPUTING

In the computing lesson, the year 3 students displayed their creativity by making Easter posters using word program.




MATH

Sharing our views on the value of saving and spending money wisely during our PSHE lesson was extremely fascinating.
























Year 7s practicing by rote.
